Fund Description

The 27four Shari'ah Active Equity Fund is a high risk portfolio that invests in SA listed Shari'ah compliant shares. Suitable for investors with a long-term investment horizon. The primary objectives are capital growth and income generation through dividends. Volatile movements in the value of capital in the short to medium-term are to be expected.

Risk Profile



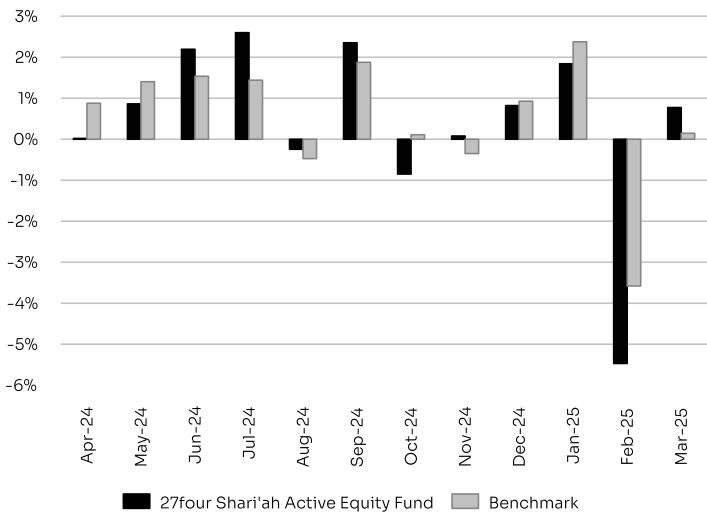

Fund Commentary

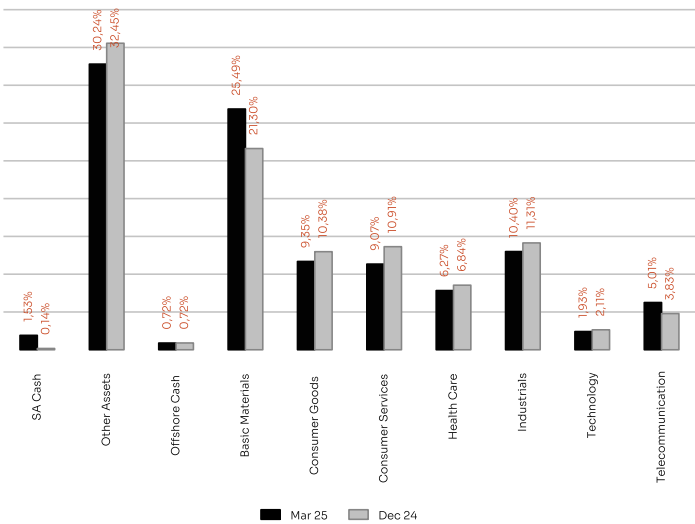
In the first quarter of 2025, financial markets delivered mixed performance across domestic and global markets. Despite global volatility, U.S. funding cuts, uncertainty around the Government of National Unity (GNU), and concerns regarding South Africa's eligibility under AGOA, domestic assets demonstrated resilience. The South African resource sector surged by 33.74%, supported by strong commodity prices, while industrials rose 4.27% and financials declined by 1.72%. Global markets, on the other hand, faced significant headwinds stemming from the Trump administration's aggressive rollout of tariffs, which raised fears of stagflation. These trade measures contributed to downward revisions in global growth forecasts and lowered U.S. equity targets, further fueling investor caution. Against this backdrop, the 27four Shari'ah Active Equity Fund posted shed 2.98%, underperforming its benchmark, which returned -1.14%. The underperformance was primarily attributed to offshore equity allocations, specifically the iShares MSCI World Islamic ETF and iShares MSCI US Islamic ETF, which were adversely affected by global equity market weakness. On the local front, the fund benefited from strong exposure to gold counters, including: Harmony Gold (+76.86%), DRD Gold (+73.90%), and Gold Fields (+67.22%). However, these gains were offset by declines in domestic consumer-focused stocks, with notable detractors including: Motus Holdings (-28.29%), Italtile (-25.56%), and Mr Price (-24.95%)

Looking ahead, we expect the Trump presidency to remain a key source of uncertainty. Beyond tariffs, we are anticipating further controversial policy rollouts from Trump. These may include intensified immigration enforcement, deregulatory pushes in energy and finance, and the potential establishment of new federal agencies like the proposed "External Revenue Service." Each of these could carry significant implications for global markets and geopolitical relations – further reinforcing the need for a diversified, flexible, and risk-aware portfolio approach. On tariffs, the April 2 "Liberation Day" measures marked a major escalation, triggering retaliation from China, the EU, and Canada. We believe tariffs are not merely tactical for Trump—they are central to his broader agenda of reshoring manufacturing and funding extended tax cuts. As a result, the global trade landscape is likely to undergo lasting structural change. While we do not expect the full suite of proposed tariffs to be implemented—given likely pushback from trading partners and the economic impact on U.S. consumers and businesses—we believe a more protectionist baseline is now firmly in place. Against this backdrop, our base case has shifted to one of sub-trend growth and elevated inflation. In response, we are maintaining our bias toward domestic assets, Europe, and China, while reducing exposure to expensive U.S. equities. Our focus remains on diversification, structural tailwinds, and the flexibility to adapt to shifting policy and market dynamics. The portfolio has adhered to its policy objective.

Glossary

Annualised performance: Annualised performance show longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Best month: Largest increase in any single month.

Highest & lowest return: The highest and lowest returns over any 1 year period since the inception date.

Max drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Sharpe ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Tracking error: The volatility of the difference in returns between a Fund and its Benchmark. Also known as active risk.

% positive months: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Fund Specific Risks

Currency exchange risk: Changes in the relative values of individual currencies may adversely affect the value of investments and any related income.
